<b>Description of Services (maximum of 100 words)</b>	The Office of the Attorney General serves victims of crime by administering the Crime Victims' Compensation Program and victim service-related grants and contracts, in addition to offering training and outreach programs.
<b>Zip Codes Where Services are Provided</b>	The State of Texas*
<b>Who is Eligible to Receive Your Services</b>	Any Texas resident or U.S. citizen that becomes a victim of a criminal act as defined by the Texas Code of Criminal Procedure resulting in serious injury, death or emotional trauma that is punishable by prison time or fines. The victim must have filed a law enforcement report within a reasonable amount of time. They must be cooperating fully with law enforcement.
<b>If you provide services to pregnant women please indicate at what stage of pregnancy your services apply (e.g. 1<sup>st</sup> month of pregnancy, 3<sup>rd</sup> month, 6<sup>th</sup> month, or 9<sup>th</sup> month)</b>	If it is determined that a woman becomes pregnant because of a sexual assault the Crime Victim's Compensation Program can assist her with all of the medical expenses up until the birth of the child. Victims can also seek assistance with injury related medical expenses, counseling and lost wages. In family violence and sexual assault cases that meet the guidelines for these services, relocation may be an option for the victim and their children if they are cooperating fully with the investigation. Victims can be any age group. This program has no financial qualification guidelines.
